(b) Los Angeles is the most traffic-congested city in the nation according to a 2012 Congestion Index with travel times 33 percent longer than when traffic is flowing freely. Honolulu is in second place. Auwe! San Francisco was in third place. (c) The Oxnard Strawberry Festival will be held on May 18-19 this year. Cost is \$12 for adults, \$8 for seniors (62+), and \$5 for kids. (d) The town of Lihue on the island of Kauai has made the list of Smithsonian’s “20 Best Small Towns to Visit” for 2013. (e) California is the worse state for business according to the American Economic Development Institute (AEDI) and Polina Corporate Real Estate, Inc.
