Hawaiian University of Hawaii News. (a) The UH fired head football coach, Norm Chow, after the Warriors embarrassing 58-7 loss to Air Force at home. The team's record dropped to 2-7 and 10-36 overall under Chow's leadership. UH has started looking for a replacement and June Jones is interested. June Jones left UH to coach at SMU after contract extension talks stalled in 2008. That was the same year that the Warriors were 12 – 1 with their only defeat coming at the hands of the University of Georgia in the Sugar Bowl. On November 21, 2015, UH lost to San Jose 42-23 in front of a crowd of 11,065 at home, the smallest crowd to watch a UH football game in over 50 years. (b) The UH and fired basketball coach, Gib Arnold, agreed to a \$700,000 settlement. \$500,000 will be paid to Gib Arnold over three years and additional \$200,000 will be paid to Arnold's attorney. UH is still waiting on a ruling from the NCAA regarding violations that occurred during Gib Arnold's tenure as head coach for the men's basketball team. (c) Now for the good news, thank goodness the UH Wahine Volleyball team that just concluded their regular season record at 26-1 and is headed to the post season ranked number 8 in the nation. Go Wahines!.

<u>Homeless Problem.</u> The U.S. Housing and Urban Development has named Los Angeles City and County as having the most homeless people in the country. More than one-third of the nation's chronically homeless live in California. The study also revealed that Honolulu has the largest number of homeless of any small U.S. city underscoring the seriousness of Hawaii homeless problem. There were more than 4,900 homeless in Honolulu. Coming in second for small cities was Santa Ana and Anaheim area of Orange County, California. The study defines a small city as one not among the 50 largest U.S. cities and not in a rural area.
