Hawaii News. (a) Destructions in Hawaii. First there was all this rain on Kauai and Oahu in May, now there is the destructive volcano eruptions and earthquakes that have destroyed dozens of homes and displaced thousands of residents on the Big Island. North Carolina officials sent 10 emergency managers and fire service officials to work in Hawaii on the response to the erupting Kilauea volcano (gee, all the way from North Carolina!). The volcano goddess **Pele** must really be angry. **President Trump** has declared the volcano destructions a disaster so federal assistance will be provided. Erosion behind a seawall has forced the removal of outdoor showers at Haleiwa Beach Park and sinkholes are undermining sidewalks and several other structures. 70 percent of Hawaii's shorelines are chronically eroding. Waikiki and the North Shore have experienced some of the most dramatic erosion over the past years.
