Variations of stuffing could include sweet rolls, Portuguese sausage or lap cheong. Sides often include mac salad, poke, poi, pineapple instead of cranberry, and of course, rice! Haupia pie is a fond dessert, or even haupia pumpkin pie.

`Ōlelo of the Month - Mahalo

Mahalo is familiar to all of us, but like many Hawaiian words, there is much more behind it than the simple "thank you." What a perfect month to examine its richer meaning!

MA - 'within' HA - 'breath of life, Divine breath or spirit of life' ALO - 'in the presence of, to share an experience with'

Literally, we might not pick up on the translation but looking at familiar word components *alo* and *ha* (aloha!) we can start to make sense of it. The *Aloha* spirit includes a deep sense of living and loving in harmony, with others and everything around you. Similarly, the essence of *mahalo* extends that spirit into gratitude, compassion, appreciation and even admiration. We develop meaningful connections to each other, our world, and our faiths by giving thanks and practicing gratitude.

With Thanksgiving on the horizon, let's not only count our blessings, but truly celebrate our appreciation and say *Mahalo*, *mahalo nui loa* (thank you very much), *mahalo piha* (wholehearted thanks/gratitude), and *Mahalo ke Akua* (thanks be to God).

Though observation of this day waned in the years after annexation, there has been renewed interest in recent years for this Hawaiian Independence Day.
