`Ōlelo This Month - Aloha

Did you know Aloha is law? In 1986, the Hawaiian government enacted the Aloha Spirit Law, and all citizens of Hawai`i are to conduct themselves according to this law.

The word *aloha* itself can be broken down into "*alo*" and "*ha*". *Alo* means presence, and *ha* is breath, so the literal translation equates to *presence of breath*, akin to *breath of life*. Additionally, as part of the Aloha Spirit Law, the following traits are outlined to remind us the full meaning of aloha:



Akahai - Kindness, to be expressed with tenderness

Lōkahi - Unity, to be expressed with harmony

Olu olu - Agreeable, to be expressed with pleasantness

Ha`aha`a - Humility, to be expressed with modesty

Ahonui - Patience, to be expressed with perseverance

You can see the acronym of those five traits spells out Aloha!

As we begin our New Year, we can get a fresh start not only with our resolutions, but with positive intention. Aloha is a great way to help us set and practice those positive intentions in our daily lives.

Lunar New Year: Year of the Rabbit

This Lunar New Year falls on January 22nd, and 2023 is the Year of the Rabbit. The Chinese Zodiac indicates that every 12 years is a cycle, so past Rabbit years include 1927, 1939, 1951, 1963, 1975, 1987, 1999, and 2011.

Some say if you are born in the Year of the Rabbit, you may prefer peace and quiet, and do not like to argue. You may be a good listener, excellent negotiator, artistic and creative. Year of Rabbit people are also said to be tenacious and ambitious, but also dislike stressful and risky situations.

Two of the most common Chinese greetings for Lunar New Year are *Gong Xi Fa Cai* (Mandarin) and *Kung Hei Fat Choi* (Cantonese), wishes for prosperity and good fortune.

While the Lunar New Year is most recognized as Chinese New Year, it is also celebrated elsewhere, such as in Vietnamese and Korean cultures. In Vietnam, it's called Tét NguyênĐán or Tét for short. In Korean, it's called Seollal.

Whichever culture or New Year you observe, may you be blessed with good health, prosperity, and happiness in 2023!
